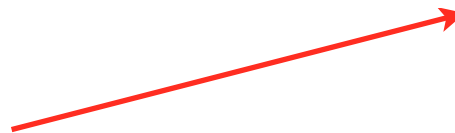

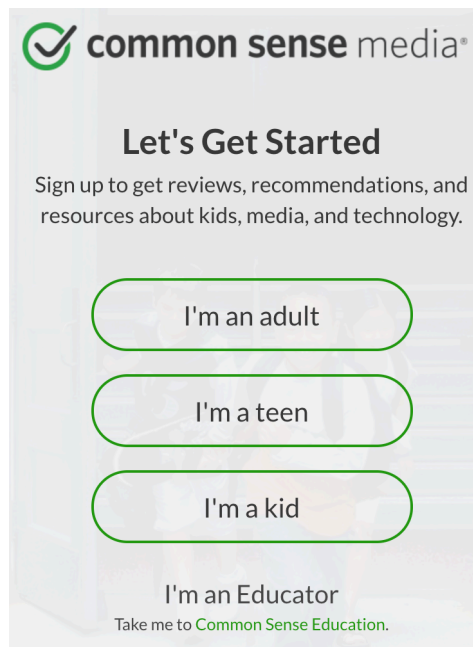

Simply click on the “Sign me up” link in the top right corner of the page. If you have already registered, you can click “Login.”

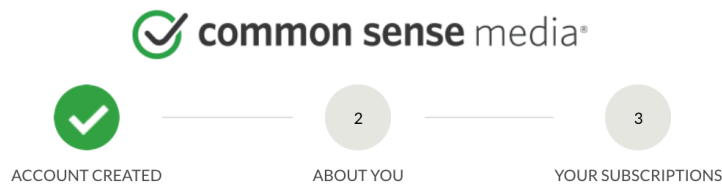


Please know that you do not need an account to use this site. However, having an account opens more options.

Complete your registration by answering a few final questions or choose “Skip for now.”



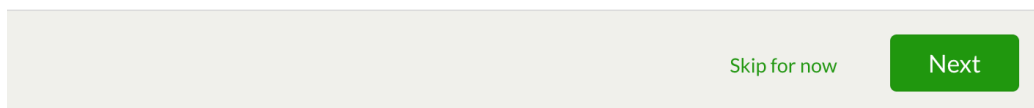

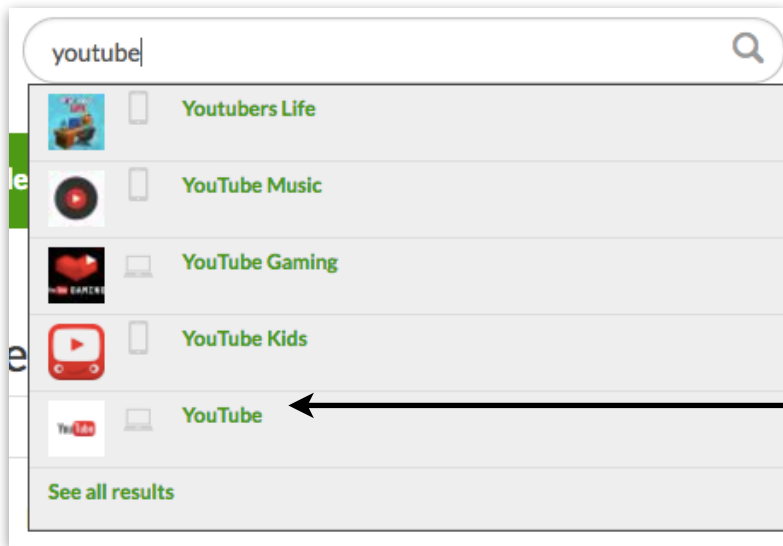

SEARCHING

If you know exactly what you are looking for, you can simply search for it using the search bar at the top right corner of the homepage.



As an example, I am going to search for the popular media site YouTube. Simply enter your search term **and you will notice that a number of search results will appear automatically in a drop-down menu.**

Select the site you are looking for, or if you don't see what you want, click on "See all results" or the search icon.

Parents need to know that there are many videos on YouTube that may not be age-appropriate for their kids. The site is entirely user-generated and relies on its community to flag videos that violate YouTube's terms of service (mostly for sexual content, language, and hate speech). Plenty of age-inappropriate content can be surfaced by typing in the most innocent of search terms, so

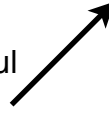


